At the Drop-Off Centers, place all of your recyclables in one bin – no pre-sorting needed! Drop boxes are convenient, clean, and accept all typical household recyclables.

towel rolls, etc

Office paper & file folders

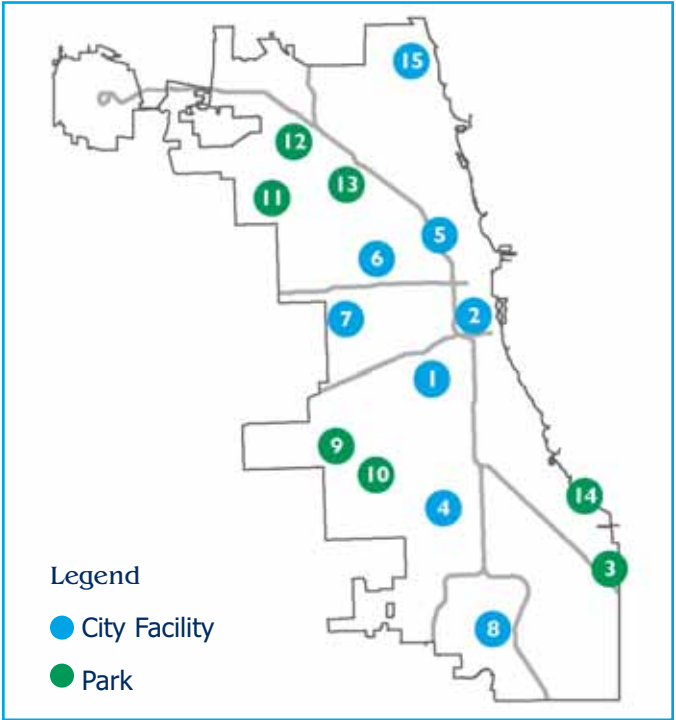
